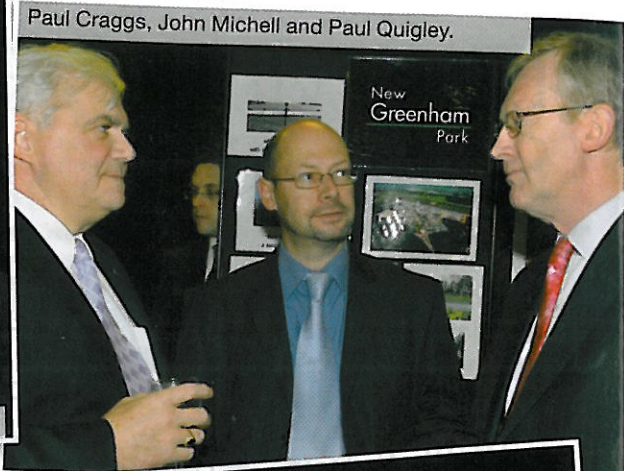

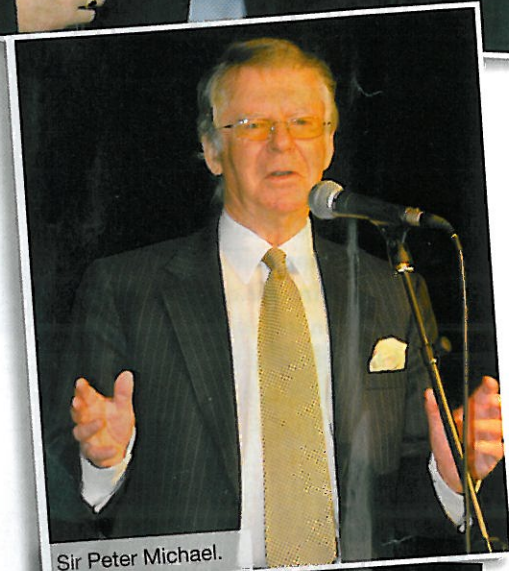
Greenham Common Trust is presented with Queen's Award

Celebration was the order of the day at New Greenham Arts as Greenham Common Trust received the Queen's Award for Enterprise: Sustainable Development, from the Lord Lieutenant of Berkshire, Mary Bayliss.

It's the second time the Trust has received the prestigious award. The first was in 2003.

Sir Peter Michael, the founding chairman of Greenham Common Trust, received the award and official citation from the Queen's Award office which was signed by the Prime Minister, Gordon Brown.

Staff and guests at the event were able to view stands from a number of the occupiers and businesses at the Trust's 150 acre New Greenham Park. These included displays by SpeedTrap, who were also granted the Queen's Award of Enterprise in April, 3T RPD, Natalie O'Donovan Design and Publishing and a demonstration of the educational website, www.sustainable-greenham.org, which the Trust launched earlier this year to highlight the regeneration of Greenham Common as a sustainable environmental, social and commercial development.



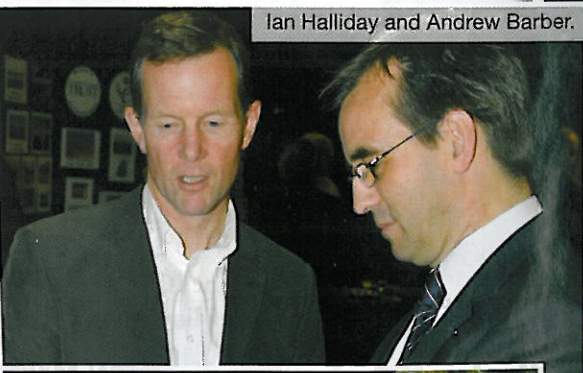

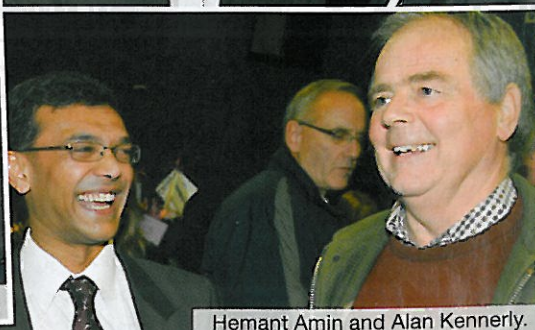
